PARISH UPDATES AS WE MOVE TO YELLOW PHASE

As we are aware Luzerne County moved to the yellow phase of reopening on Friday, May 29, 2020. However, each parish has been advised to open their respective churches only after they feel comfortable with their procedures to protect the health and safety of our community. St. Ignatius will not resume public daily Masses until Monday, June 8, 2020 with a 25% capacity that adheres to proper social distancing guidelines. The number we can accommodate safely is 80 people. We will not resume weekend Masses until the week off June 20-21, 2020 with a revised schedule.

All parishioners will receive a mailing after June 3, 2020 stating all protocols and procedures which must be followed by all planning to return to liturgy.

We look forward to welcoming you back, however, it must be clearly understood that the return will be different for all of us due to CDC protocols and procedures. Again, this will be explained more fully in the mailing you will receive this coming week.

Thank you for your kind attention to these matters. Your patience and understanding are deeply appreciated. Our life of prayer at liturgy will be a bit different!

All parishioners are informed that the celebration of funerals will start after June 8, 2020 mindful of 80 people able to attend and all socially distanced with masks for the entire Funeral Liturgy.

All parishioners are informed that baptisms can be celebrated once again after June 8, 2020 with proper protocols in place.

All visitations to homes and hospitals remain suspended unless there is an imminent danger of death. CDC guidelines must be followed.

Parishioners have been continuing to help out at Al Beech West Side Food Pantry and several put in a hard five-hour day this week in the blazing hot sun. Father, Kim McNulty, and her son, Kevin, worked one of the four drive-thru distribution stations at the pantry after unloading 5 pallets of produce beforehand. The Pantry served 880+ people during Wednesday's two-hour distribution. Since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Al Beech West Side Food Pantry and the associated community collaboration has provided 24,815 people approximately 360,000 meals. We thank you for your continued support, so we are able to assist the Pantry with our monetary donations and St. Vincent DePaul Fund.

receive You sacramentally,
come at least spiritually into my heart.
I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You.
Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.
