

The Diocese of Scranton has asked all parishes to implement the following health precautions:

- 1. Holy Water fonts are empty.
- 2. During the Sign of Peace please make a gesture rather than physical contact.
- 3. We have already suspended the use of the cup, it will remain suspended until further notice.
- 4. Those who receive Eucharist in their mouths are encouraged to receive the Eucharist in their hands, however receiving on one's tongue is a personal choice.
- 5. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Celebrants will use a hand sanitizer before they distribute Holy Communion.
- Finally, people who don't feel well or the elderly wishing to avoid crowds, please be aware that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass is lifted until further notice. Please stay home and be safe.

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CEMETERIES CLEAN UP



YEAR OF SAINT JOSEPH

This year marks the 150th Anniversary of Pope Pius IX's decree naming Saint Joseph, husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary and foster-father of Jesus, as the Patron of the Universal Church. In commemoration of this anniversary and recognizing the fitting time for the Church to invoke the intercession of this guardian, His Excellency, Bishop Joseph C. Bambera has declared this year as a "Year of Saint Joseph" to be observed in the Diocese of Scranton from March 19, 2020 to March 19, 2021.
