

This year as an added incentive to the Diocesan Annual Appeal, a \$2,000.00 check will be sent to each parish that has a 10% increase in NEW DONOR'S, no matter what they donate. Our goal as a parish is \$77,000.00 and for every dollar that is collected over that amount, .75 cents is returned to our parish. Presently, we are at 240 donors and 59% of our goal. LEARNING TO JOURNEY TOGETHER AS CATHOLICS

OUR LITURGICAL JOURNEY

If we attend a baseball game, hockey game or other sporting event we certainly enjoy it more if we know what there is to know about this particular event. Although the Mass is far from being a sporting event the Church, for many years, has called us to engage our attendance at Mass with "full, active and conscious participation." These words are loaded with meaning which lead us in many directions. So, we invite you to join us on a prayerful liturgical journey which will continue each week so that we can enrich our spiritual lives by meditating/thinking about the information offered about the Mass. As we journey, we might be in for a few surprises, or simply want to question something you will read here.

WHAT IS PURGATORY?

We are all familiar with the term, but it causes much consternation when we have to reflect on it. So, I first give one definition regarding Purgatory. The definition refers to purgatory as a state wherein, according to Roman Catholic doctrine, the souls of those who die in God's grace may make satisfaction for past sins and so become fit for heaven. Both Pope St. John Paul II and Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI declared that the term does not indicate a place, but a condition of existence thus reinforcing the definition just given. The Catholic Church teaches that a soul who dies in God's grace and friendship, will enter into "the blessedness of heaven-through a purification or immediately" (*CCC* 1021). Since "nothing unclean will enter" into heaven, purgatory is the state, or purification, not punishment, wherein souls become fit to enjoy heaven (Revelation 21:27). As we see in the Old Testament, in the book of Maccabees, we are encouraged to pray for the deadespecially during the month of November.

GUIDELINES FOR THE MASS INTENTION BOOK – 2022

The book of Mass Intentions for St. Ignatius Loyola Parish will open for 2022 on Monday, November 8th. We respectfully ask that your requests be for death anniversary Masses (4 Masses per year per family.) We are required by Canon Law #953 that the parish may accept only the number of Masses that can be fulfilled within a year. We will accept requests for (7:30 a.m. and 12:10 p.m. – Monday – Friday and one weekend liturgy.) We will also be eliminating the 7 day and Month's Mind Masses to enable us to fulfill the requests made when the book is opened. The 8:30 a.m. weekend Mass is reserved for the people of the parish.

Also, please know that due to the number of Masses presently on record, the parish will no longer be able to accept Mass intentions from an individual's estate (you may wish to consider a trust fund which can be established to distribute a certain amount each year to fulfill your requests. This would be handled by your estate planner, no more than 4 Masses per year can be accepted.)

We would ask that you contact the rectory regarding a Mass intention directly and not make the request at the funeral home. Again, we are required to only accept the Mass intentions that can be fulfilled within a year. Your understanding as well as your cooperation is appreciated. Please call Jen at 570-288-6446 (between the hours of 9 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. Monday – Friday) to schedule the Masses.

Diocese of Scranton Guidelines for Public Masses **Revised November 1, 2021**

We, the Parish of St. Ignatius Loyola, join all the parishes of the Diocese of Scranton to continue to joyfully welcome the faithful to return to Mass inperson to celebrate the Holy Eucharist, the source and summit of the Christian life.

FACE MASKS

The Diocesan guidelines continues to strongly recommend vaccinated and non-vaccinated individuals to wear masks inside for Mass and other indoor gatherings in order to protect the health and safety of all in attendance. We are most grateful for the cooperation regarding the mask request with our goal of protecting our neighbors. You are reminded to continue to maximize the use of space as much as possible.

DISTRIBUTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

All Priests, Deacons and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are required to wear a face mask while distributing communion. The minister must stop and sanitize his/her hands if direct contact is made with a person's tongue before continuing. We respectfully request anyone who wishes to receive communion on their tongue to go to the end of the line. The distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended at this time.

HAND HYGIENE

Hand washing and sanitizing is essential in preventing the spread of the virus. It is highly recommended that everyone takes advantage of the sanitizers located at the entrances of the church. The Sign of Peace will be extended without physical contact.

LIVE STREAMING MASS

We will continue to livestream the 8:30 a.m. Mass for those who must stay home. The 8:30 a.m. Mass is now available for in-person attendance as well.

CONFESSIONS

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available on Saturdays from 12:00 noon -12:30 p.m. Please be aware that face masks are required for the Sacrament.

Vaccinations are Encouraged

The Diocese of Scranton strongly recommends that all members of the Catholic Community who are eligible become fully vaccinated for COVID-19. The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith at the Vatican has stated that it is morally acceptable to receive the current COVID-19 vaccines. Individuals remain free to exercise discretions regarding vaccination based upon their own reasons of conscience. The Diocese of Scranton will not provide support, written or otherwise, for individuals seeking exemption from the vaccine based on theological or religious grounds.

There is no requirement for face coverings or masks in the parishes of the Diocese of Scranton. There are no requests by the parish regarding information about vaccination status to be admitted to the church.

Face Masks or Face Coverings for Catholic Schools and Parish Religious Education Program

Face coverings are required in all Catholic Schools and Parish Religious Education Programs within the Diocese of Scranton. Parents/Guardians attending programs in either Catholic School or Religious Instruction Classes are required to adhere to the masking policy.

Once again, we are most grateful for your cooperation and understanding as we continue to do our best to end this pandemic. The decisions are based on the most up to date public health information. We are most grateful for your patience throughout these days. God Bless!
